

M. Jeffrey Baker Architect



Jeff Baker is a partner in the firm of Mesick Cohen Wilson Baker based in Albany, New York. For over thirty years a substantial portion of the firm's practice has been devoted to the preservation and restoration of historic buildings, most of which are listed on the National Register of Historic Places or are listed as Historic Landmarks. Jeff has been with the firm for close to thirty years.

He has worked on the restoration of Thomas Jefferson's Monticello in Charlottesville, Virginia, Thomas Jefferson's Poplar Forest in Lynchburg, Virginia, James Madison's Montpelier, several mansions in Newport, Rhode Island designed by McKim Mead and White, Richard Morris Hunt, H.H. Richardson and others significant 19th century architects, the reconstruction of the 1660's Brick Chapel at St. Mary's City, Maryland, the restoration of the Vermont State House in Montpelier, Vermont as well as the New York State Capitol, the restoration of the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Albany, New York, Stratford Hall, Virginia, Christ Church, Virginia and the restoration/renovation of Thomas Jefferson's Pavilion X at the University of Virginia.

Most recently, Jeff has been the architect in charge of the on-going restoration work here at Frank Lloyd Wright's Florida Southern College, which stands as the largest single collection of Frank Lloyd Wright in the world.
